Today, many Claretians, from all cultural origins, ages and mission contexts, show an intense desire to grow in the Spirit, joyfully cultivating, in the midst of the difficulties, their response to the call they have received." What is the "Forge Project in our daily life"?

It is a renewal project that aims to help us rekindle the fire of Claretian vocation and grow in missionary zeal.

Why is it called the Forge?

Because the forge is an allegory used by St. Anthony Mary Claret in his Autobiography to describe his spiritual experience.

For whom is this project?

For all Claretians in the world who have already made their perpetual profession.

To what need does it intend to respond?

To the need of finding a new answer, both at personal and community level, to the question of our Claretian identity in the world today.

How long will it last?

Four years: 2011-2014. The year 2010 will be a time of motivation and preparation.

When will it begin?

Officially it will begin on November 28, 2010, on the first t Sunday of Advent.

Who will lead it?

The project depends on the General Government. The General Prefecture of Spirituality, in collaboration with an international team of Claretians, will prepare, encourage and coordinate its implementation.

Is it a project for the whole Congregation?

Yes, but it will be adapted to the needs and characteristics of each place.

What does it consist of?

It is to relive, over four years, the fundamental experiences of the Claretian vocation as articulated in the methodology of the Forge.

What is needed to participate in it?

An attitude of open-mindedness and inquisitiveness and also a desire to grow in the life of the Spirit according to the Claretian charism.
